



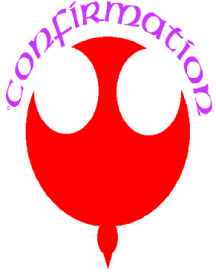

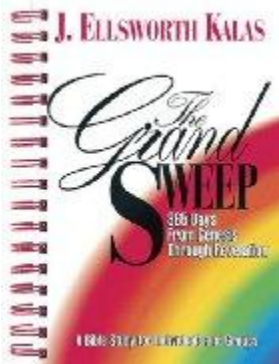


## Bible Study

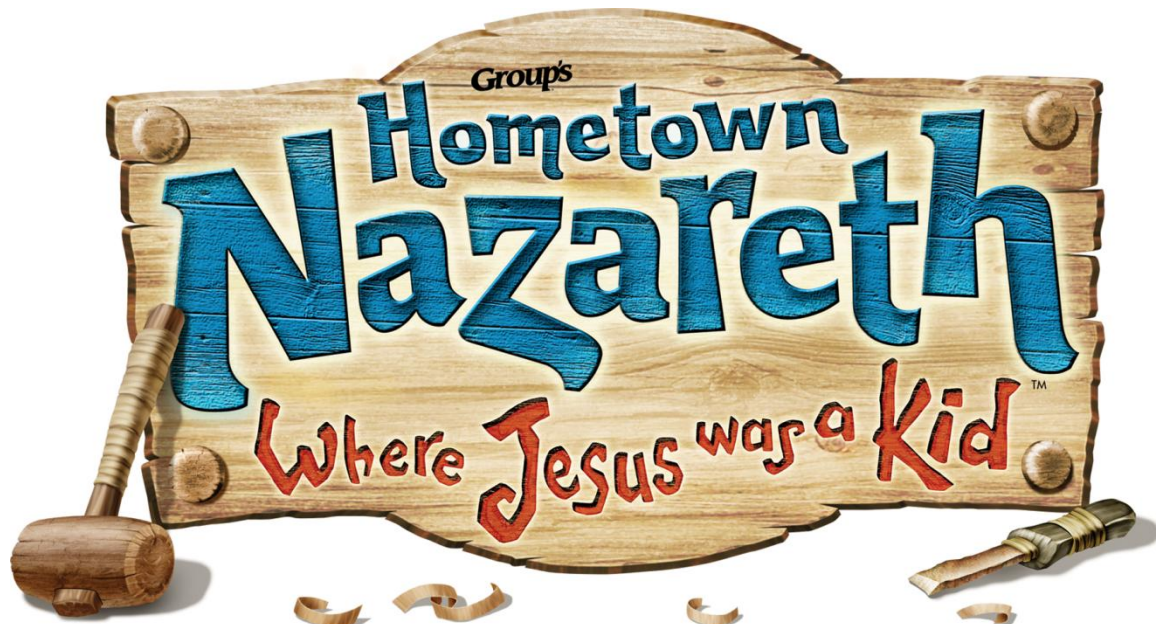

**F.Y.H.....For Your Health**

Recently bedbugs have been in the spotlight and with summer and travel time coming up here are a few tips:

- Bed bugs are small, brownish insects, about 4mm (1/4 inch) long and visible to the naked eye. They feed on human blood. Infestation may cause irritating, itchy bite reactions .. and anxiety!
- How to detect them-itchy skin and insect bites are clues that you may have them in your home. You will usually see 3 or 4 bites in a straight line or group. Arms, legs, and the back are more susceptible to bites. Look for black stains, or “blood spots” on your bedding. They are usually brought in by suitcase, handbags, on clothing and furniture.
- How to prevent them- vacuum regularly and stay clear of clutter, they flourish in clutter. Avoid picking up used mattresses or secondhand furniture because it is hard to see whether they harbor the bed bugs.
- Treatment- Bed bug bites will usually go away without treatment. However, see a doctor if the bite does not seem to heal or looks infected.
- Get rid of – Clean infected area thoroughly. Scrub mattress with a stiff brush. Launder all bed linens in hot water. Vacuum carpets using crevice tool to get to baseboards and crevices in furniture. There are products on the market to use but be careful what they contain as ingredients may be harmful to you and the environment.

**This Season’s Hot Topic... Here Comes the Sun!**

When the summer sun sizzles and you’re feeling burned to a crisp, take your pick of these homemade healers.

Oh- and don’t forget the sunscreen next time!!

- Fill your tub with cool to lukewarm water, add some baking soda, and soak for as long as you like.
- Place chilled slices of cucumber on your simmering skin.
- Fill an 8 oz. spray bottle with cold water and add 6 drops of lavender oil. Shake well, then spray on the burned areas.
- Dab whole milk on the burn for 15 minutes every 2 to 4 hours.
- Brew two black tea bags in a cup of water for 5 minutes, then chill them and place on sunburned areas. Cooled tea bags are especially soothing on sunburned eyelids-just squeeze out the liquid before laying them on your closed peepers.
- Gently apply yogurt to your scorched skin.

Marianne and I will be offering a regular adult, infant, and child CPR class in August or September. Watch for dates.

## News from Worship Work Area

### Altar Flower Change

Beginning August 1, 2011, the use of fresh flowers on each side of the altar will be replaced by seasonal silk arrangements. Through July 31st. the present altar flower calendar remains the same. There are 12 vases still available within that time frame (between now and July 31), and can be reserved by signing your name to the current flower calendar, filling out the supplied form and turning it and payment in to the office.

Starting August 1, people wishing to provide fresh flowers for use on the altar must sign the NEW altar flower sheet, purchase their desired flowers and bring them to the church prior to that Sunday service.

Please note that only 1 arrangement per Sunday may adorn the altar and should be approximately 12 inches high (including the container) and 15 inches wide. You will find the NEW sign up sheet next to the current calendar, on the bulletin board in the hallway, outside the sanctuary.

Please remember:

1. To insure that only 1 (one) arrangement per Sunday is on the altar, your desired date must be reserved by signing the NEW flower calendar on the bulletin board in the hallway
2. Flowers should be approximately 12 inches high (including container) & 15 inches wide.
3. They will be purchased and brought by YOU to the church prior to your desired Sunday
4. Please notify the office 2 weeks prior to your desired date if you want a dedication of any kind printed in the bulletin.

## PATRIOTIC PARFAIT

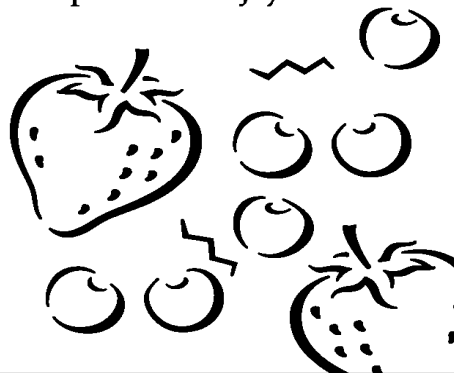
On the 4th of July, make this healthy, festive dessert to share with family and friends.
